1. Call to Order

2. Freedom of Information Act Compliance

3. Approval of Minutes

a. Regular Public Safety Committee Meeting of April 6, 2015

A motion to approve the minutes of the April 6, 2015 meeting of the Public Safety Committee was made by Mr. Harkins and seconded by Mr. Edwards. The motion was approved by a vote of 3-0.

5. New Business

a. 4th Quarter 2014 Crime Statistics – Capt. Joey Woodward

Capt. Joey Woodward, of the Beaufort County Sheriff's Office, presented a PowerPoint outlining the detailed crime statistics for the 4th quarter of 2014, as cited in the Uniform Crime Report, which is included in the agenda packet.

He reviewed the breakdown of Crimes Against Persons, noting there were no murders and 3 forcible rapes, with 1 rape case closed with no warrant being issued, 1 changed to an arrest for assault and battery, and 1 involving an ex-boyfriend. Statistics for Crimes Against Property were also reviewed, and Capt. Woodward indicated the larcenies were mostly shoplifting in the Walmart area. Details of the vehicles collisions were reviewed, with 3 fatalities reported. Mr. Edwards expressed his amazement at the number of hit and runs, but Capt. Woodward stated these are not necessarily moving violations but could occur with minor parking lot collisions.

Capt. Woodward outlined the traffic and criminal tickets and warnings issued by the patrol and marine patrol. He reviewed the marine patrol statistics and explained the various activities performed by the marine patrol, which include checks at the recycling drop site, since they also act as the environmental crimes unit.

The volunteer hours were reviewed for the reserve deputies and volunteers. Capt. Woodward also reviewed the detailed breakdown of drug violations, broken down by area of the Island and by the type of drug violation. He finished his presentation by outlining the total calls for service for both the 4th quarter and a total for the year 2014 of 77,982. He explained for the Committee what was involved with each type of call listed, and the calls for service handled by the Special Enforcement Unit (SEU), formerly the Traffic Unit.

A brief discussion followed concerning the higher number of Crimes Against Property in the Palmetto Dunes/Shelter Cove area, which Capt. Woodward indicated was probably a result of shoplifting in Belks and surrounding shopping areas during the holiday season. Chairman Grant noted the increase in vehicle collisions, and Capt. Woodward stated that patrol efforts would continue, speed signs would be used, and problem areas would continue to be monitored. He noted that tickets for texting had been issued, however, making cases are difficult, but those ticketed are aware that texting is not allowed.

Chairman Grant asked about the use and training of reserve deputies. Capt. Woodward explained there is no set schedule for them, they ride with other officers or by themselves, they receive the same training as regular deputies, and they work for free. Sheriff P.J. Tanner assured the Committee that reserve deputies are fully trained deputy sheriffs, receiving as much training as regular deputies, they achieve academy certification as reserve officers, and they follow all policies and procedures set by the Sheriff. He noted some work full-time, but prefer not to receive compensation, and they perform a fantastic job, and he would love to have more reserve deputies.

George Grotz from Palmetto Hall asked about the breakdown of type of drugs, whether hard or soft, to determine trends. Capt. Woodward pointed out the breakdown included in the Uniform Crime Report, and Mr. Grotz was provided a copy.

b. 1st Quarter 2015 Crime Statistics – Capt. Joey Woodward

Capt. Woodward presented a PowerPoint outlining the detailed crime statistics for the 1st quarter of 2015, as cited in the Uniform Crime Report, which is included in the agenda packet.

He reviewed the statistics and breakdown of Crimes Against Persons and Crimes Against Property, noting that suspects have already been caught in some of the larcenies and headway is being made on others. The statistics and breakdown of vehicle collisions were outlined, as well as the traffic and criminal tickets and warnings issued. He noted that the statistics for the marine patrol may not be correct due to the changeover to a new system, but he did note several activities they were involved in during the 1st quarter, including assisting with a body recovery in the Palmetto Bay area. He outlined the volunteer hours and detailed the calls for service, including those handled by the Special Enforcement Unit, averaging 136 calls over a 24-hour period.

Chairman Grant noted the continued increase in this quarter for vehicle collisions and asked for suggestions to bring these numbers down. Sheriff Tanner noted that driver inattention would always be a problem, and with a stronger economy bringing more motorists to the Island, more vehicle collisions will occur. He suggested that a traffic trailer that is portable, displays instant speed for the motorist, and has the technology to capture data to enable officers to be deployed when and where needed would be helpful and has been requested and rejected in the budget for several years.

Chairman Grant and Sheriff Tanner discussed the role of the Sheriff's Office in encouraging student communication with law enforcement during the summer when they have no access to SRO's (School

Resource Officers), who do such a great job when school is in session. Chairman Grant expressed concern about how he, as a Council Member, should respond to inquiries about incidents in his Ward that may occur. Sheriff Tanner encouraged all Council Members to direct inquiries to him at any time. He discussed with Mr. Grant the policies, procedures and training for officers that are in place that far exceed anything in South Carolina, and the reality based training beginning in June that will be available to all law enforcement in the County.

Mr. Harkins and Sheriff Tanner discussed the topic of camera use by law enforcement. Sheriff Tanner reviewed the history of dash cameras required by 2005 legislation for DUI arrests, the problems encountered in outdated technology funded by the State, and the eventual return of VHS cameras to the State and the purchase of dash cameras costing Beaufort County citizens almost \$2 million to date. Because of cases in North Charleston and Ferguson, he noted the General Assembly is now considering a mandate for use of body cameras by law enforcement. He cited the last deadly force case in Beaufort County was in 2005, and since then 2.7 million calls for service have been handled without any use of force issues.

Sheriff Tanner outlined privacy issues involved, with the video of innocent victims, their homes, contents, and businesses that would be subject to FOIA requests and that could end up on Youtube. He also pointed out the additional cost that would be involved in hiring clerks to handle a growing video library, storage needed for the videos, and time required to respond to additional FOIA requests. He also expressed concern that cameras would deter from obtaining confidential information from the general public and from students communicating with School Resource Officers. Sheriff Tanner noted he had shared his concerns with local legislators and hoped that before a mandate is ordered, that funding and other issues would be addressed by the General Assembly.

Chairman Grant and the committee members thanked Capt. Woodward for his reports and thanked Sheriff Tanner for his comments. Chairman Grant expressed appreciation for everything the Beaufort County Sheriff's Offices does, noting they do an excellent job, and he asked them to continue to do so.

6. Adjournment

At 10:44 a.m. Mr. Harkins moved to adjourn the meeting and Mr. Edwards seconded. The motion was approved by a vote of 3-0.

DATA SOURCE CRITERIA

All law enforcement agencies in the state compile incident-based data on crimes occurring in their jurisdiction. While one incident can result in multiple offenses being tracked in the local system, only data that meets the national criteria is forwarded to the SC Law Enforcement Division.

Currently if a burglary is reported and property stolen, two offenses are tracked locally but only the major crime, burglary, is reported using the South Carolina Incident-Based Reporting System. This data is collected by SLED and then forwarded to the FBI, which administers the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program.

The Beaufort County Sheriff's Office will begin using the UCR criteria to account for crime in this report so that it will more closely match the data published by the FBI.


Crimes Against Persons will include Murder, Aggravated Assault, Robbery and Forcible Rape.

Crimes Against Property will include Burglary, Larceny and Auto Theft.
Vehicle Collisions will remain the same as they are not reportable UCR crimes.

This report is based only on the crimes that occurred on Hilton Head Island.

A A An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury (involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possibly internal injury, severe laceration, loss of consciousness due to injury, etc.)

R Taking or _____ to take, under confrontational circumstances, anything of value from another person by _____ or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

F R Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against the person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the person is unable to give consent. A person may _____ to give consent due to: very young or very old, mental or physical incapacity, intoxication, the influence of drugs.




