Also we have a piece that is being commissioned called *Cycle* by the family of one of the gentlemen who was killed bicycling. Both these will come forward to Town Council in March for approval for placement within this area.

We have ten other sites previously approved and we are looking to bring forward a Public Art Master Plan in the coming months that will basically look at the Island as a whole and say we need these 25 sites. That is what we will look at for approved locations so we can stop peacemealing locations coming forward to you.

Councilman Ames asked Ms. Lopko if she has gotten feedback from citizens on locations that we already have art being exhibited. Are we getting any feedback that might guide us as to what locations are well received and what might not be? Ms. Lopko responded the few comments she has received like regarding the family sculpture that is there in Chaplin Linear Park is there is no place to park and look at it. The general concerns is access to the art.

Councilman Ames said he believes this is a great location for public art.

Councilman Lennox moved to approve. Councilman Ames seconded. The motion unanimously passed.

Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Public Facilities Committee recommend to Town Council a name for the proposed park to be located at 80 & 90 Pope Avenue. Staff recommends the name of Forest Beach Community Park.

The Parks & Recreation Commission met on January 11, 2018 and their agenda included consideration of Staff's recommended name for the park. After four failed motions that considered other names, the Commission voted 2 in favor and four abstaining to recommend the name Forest Beach Park at Coligny to Town Council.

Summary: The Town of Hilton Head Island owns a tract of land in the Coligny area located at 80 & 90 Pope Avenue that is referred to as the "boneyard". This site is currently the location of dumpsters and recycling containers, and is used for construction staging, material storage, and overflow parking. In August of 2012, Town Council approved moving forward with design, permitting, and construction of a park on this site.

The goal and intent of the park's name is to provide a clear and brief name that emphasizes the park's function, location, physical features, or association with Hilton Head Island. The naming schedule is evident with the Town's existing park names (see Exhibit A). Based on this rationale, staff considered the following names in the course of developing our recommendation:

- 1. Forest Beach Community Park
- 2. Coligny Community Park

Town staff worked with the neighborhood property owners association throughout the development of the project and the Forest Beach Owners' Association POA has asked that the following names be considered:

- 1. Forest Beach Family Park
- 2. Forest Beach Community Park
- 3. Forest Beach Park

The name Forest Beach Community Park is consistent with current park naming conventions, consistent with the LMO requirements, and is one of the names the local POA recommended.

Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue uses a nationally recognized protocol to evaluate all development names (public and private) on Hilton Head Island. Coligny Community Park was eliminated from consideration due to concern from Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue to avoid potential confusion with Coligny Beach Park, Coligny Plaza, and Coligny Villas.

Background: To complete the Development Permit Review (DPR) for the park at 80 & 90 Pope Ave. the park name must be approved. This approval is critical for several reasons, among those it is the unique location identification used by responders during an emergency to avoid confusion. Approval of the DPR is essential to begin construction as planned spring of 2019.

The following criteria from the Town's LMO were followed when developing the name of the park:

16-2-103.N.4.a

No new development project name, or proposed modified name of a development, except phases of the same development project, shall duplicate, be phonetically similar to, or in any way be likely to be confused with an existing development project name, despite the use of prefixes or suffixes.

16-2-103.N.4.b

Names shall be simple, logical, easy to read and pronounce, and clear and brief. Use of frivolous or complicated words or unconventional spellings in names shall not be approved.

16-2-103.N.4.c

It is desirable to use names that have some association with Hilton Head Island and specifically with the immediate location of the street or place, such as reference to local history or physiographic features.

16-2-103.N.4.d

The proposed name of the development project shall in all respects emphasize the project's distinctive name rather than the name of the company or corporation that owns the development. This will reduce confusion on the location of a separate development owned by the same company or corporation.
