Work Group: Building a Connected and Collaborative Community Fabric

- The meeting began at 4:01 pm.
- The work group members were provided with a photograph release form, giving permission to take photographs of the members of the workgroup for newsletters and other items.
- Linda Piekut and Tayloe Cook volunteered to be the Inclusive work group co-captains, who will share updates with the Development Team.
- Taylor Tadd explained that if participants had a thought or idea derived from a discussion that could potentially change the direction of a present topic, they can post their ideas on the dock drawn on the white board to be revisited at another time.
- Taylor introduced the Connected and Collaborative Community Fabric Activity. The activity
 is a process for gathering a broad range of inputs to assist in drafting the strategies and
 tactics for Our Plan. Group members were asked to review photograph displays and place
 post its notes on selected photographs with a couple words that identify what the photograph
 represents about a multidimensional and inclusive community fabric.
- Group members were provided with post its notes and began the activity. Group members shared a few of their selected photos with the group then sorted the post its notes into common themes/concepts.
