a) Proposed Parks & Recreation Commission 2023 Meeting Schedule

b) Mid-Island Park Recommendation – Jennifer Ray

Jennifer Ray provided staff's presentation as included in the packet. The Board expressed many positive comments about the progress and direction of the project. Additionally, the Board voiced several concerns listed below:

- The activity fields should remain as general use fields
- Maintenance crews of the park will require additional staff
- Crossing the street for the disc golf course will be dangerous

There were additional comments from the public. Frank Babel spoke about the district development around the park, as well as the speed of vehicles. Also, he suggested that the town do a bike pathway study for park access.

Chairman Kisiah asked for a motion to approve the plan as presented and to recommend the plan for adoption by Town Council. Mr. Parsons made a motion to approve. Mrs. Kristian seconded. Motion passed with a vote of 5-0-0.

c) Parks and Rec 2022 Community Survey Results – Taylor Ladd

Taylor Ladd provided an overview of the community survey as included in the packet. After the presentation, she answered questions from the Commission. The Commission discussed the survey and expressed several concerns outlined below:

- The misleading question about funding is a problem
- The is a major problem with parking, particularly around certain parks
- There may be a lack of survey response from some demographics of the community
- Community feedback about park safety is a major concern

Chairman Kisiah asked for a motion to approve the community survey report and submit the report to town council as presented. Mr. Manesiotis moved to approve. Vice-Chairman Zurilla seconded. Motion passed with a vote of 5-0-0.

Following the survey discussion, Chairman Kisiah asked for staff to schedule a presentation on the parking master plan for parks and park safety.

d) Parks and Rec Master Plan Recommendation – Taylor Ladd

Taylor Ladd presented the list of recommendations for review for the Commission. The Commission made several additions to the recommendations. The list was updated during the meeting. The Commission voted to forward their recommendations as noted in the staff memo with additions discussed to Town Council for consideration. Mr. Manesiotis moved to approve. Vice-Chairman Zurilla seconded. Motion passed with a vote of 5-0-0.

SUMMARY:

The State's enabling legislation assigns the Planning Commission the duty to prepare "an annual listing of priority projects for consideration by the Town Council prior to their preparation of the capital budget." Staff facilitates meetings with the Planning Commission's Capital Improvements Program Committee which makes recommendations to the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission CIP Recommendations are provided to Town Council prior to their budget deliberations which are tentatively scheduled to occur in May 2023.
