SUBJECT: Islander's Beach Park Master Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Parks and Recreation Commission review the Master Plan for proposed improvements for Islander's Beach Park and forward a recommendation of approval to Town Council.

SUMMARY:

Based on recommendations approved through the Parks and Recreation Master Plan and Our Plan, Town Council approved funding in the FY22 and FY23 Capital Budget for an effort to implement improvements for Islander's Beach Park. Further consideration for the park has been granted through Resolution 2022-05 which was passed to address community concerns with regards to beach park parking, access, and passes.

BACKGROUND:

In March 2022, Town Council passed Resolution 2022-05 pertaining to parking at Townowned beach parks with specific policy aimed to improve access and parking at Islander's Beach Park.

In April 2022, staff and their consultant team initiated a planning process to address concerns identified for Islander's Beach Park, which has been open and used as a public beach access park since 1999. Early in the process, the scope of work for park improvements was to address drainage issues, parking, and pedestrian access into the park. This led to the identification of other opportunities to improve overall park amenities including bike parking, vehicular circulation, and the playground area. The Master Plan for Islander's Beach Park includes the following improvements:

- Improved crosswalks on Folly Field Road to provide safe crossings for bikes and pedestrians entering the park,
- Three pathways into and through the park for beach access,
- Improved stormwater management and drainage,

- Additional bike parking areas,
- A new playground,
- Additional vehicular parking with circulation improvements,
- New parking for golf carts,
- On-street parking for non-beach pass holders, and
- Improved beach access road with storage area.

SUBJECT: Patterson Family Park Master Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Parks and Recreation Commission review the Master Plan for proposed development of the Patterson Family Park and forward a recommendation of approval to Town Council.

SUMMARY:

Based on recommendations approved through Our Plan, Town Council approved funding in the FY22 and FY23 Capital Budget to develop a small neighborhood park at the property currently known as Patterson Family Tract. This project is also funded under a Community Development Block Grant.

BACKGROUND:

In July 2022, staff and their consultant team developed a project scope for the planning and design of the Patterson Family Park, a currently undeveloped parcel. Based on community input, the scope of work identified opportunities for a small neighborhood park with amenities including bike and pedestrian circulation, passive recreational uses, vehicular parking, activity zones for adults and children, covered gathering space and viewsheds to Broad Creek. The Master Plan for Patterson Family Park includes the following improvements:

- Pedestrian & vehicular connectivity with the surrounding neighborhood,
- Passive open lawn space,
- Activity zone with playground and outdoor fitness stations,
- Covered pavilion with restrooms, tables, and seating areas, and
- Overlook area with views of Broad Creek.

SUBJECT: Shelter Cove Park Expansion Master Plan

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Parks and Recreation Commission review the Master Plan for proposed improvements for the Shelter Cove Park Expansion and forward a recommendation of approval to Town Council.

SUMMARY:

Based on recommendations approved through the Parks and Recreation Master Plan and Our Plan, Town Council approved funding in the FY22 and FY23 Capital Budget for an effort to expand the Shelter Cover Community Park onto an adjacent, undeveloped Townowned parcel.

BACKGROUND:

In April 2022, staff and their consultant team developed a project scope for the expansion of Shelter Cove Community Park, which has been open to the public since 2015. The scope of work identified opportunities for enhancements to park amenities including vehicular parking, the playground expansion, and views to Broad Creek. The Master Plan for Shelter Cove Park Expansion includes the following improvements:

- Expansion of the existing park's Promenade,
- Pathway network through an existing forested area,
- Expanded passive open lawn spaces with public art,
- A larger, more inclusive playground,
- Additional vehicular parking, and
- Iconic overlook structure with views of Broad Creek.
