Where to Find Zip Code Data on Local COVID-19 Cases

Due to changes in the way the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) shares data, we are unable to provide local zip code data and other information related to the number of coronavirus cases in our community on the COVID-19 Hub page on our website. DHEC, which has made changes to its data sharing platform, provides this information to our website. This has temporarily affected our ability to share the information you may be searching for. We are actively working to restore the information to our COVID-19 Hub page. Until then, if you are seeking local COVID-19 data by zip code, please visit www.scdhec.gov. We apologize for any inconvenience and will notify you once the issue has been resolved.

November 3 General Election Day

Tomorrow, Tuesday, November 3, 2020 is General Election Day. Many of you have already cast absentee ballots. For those of us who waiting to vote on Tuesday, we caution you to be prepared for your voting adventure. People have experienced long lines during early voting so there may be long lines tomorrow as well. Make sure you well prepared to follow the guidelines in this COVID-19 environment. On Election Day, you will need to show up at your designated polling place in order to cast your vote. Polls open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

- Make sure you know your polling place.
- Make sure you take your ID.
- Wear your mask.
- Expect to stand six feet away from the persons you are in line with.
- Bring a chair in case the line is long and you need something to sit on.

Beach Parking Passes

Our 2021-2022 beach parking passes are on sale. They are available only to Town of Hilton Head Island property owners and residents. Passes are \$30 per vehicle and are valid until December 31, 2022. Passes bring perks such as use of designated parking spaces at Islanders Beach Park and Driessen Beach Park and meter free parking at the Town's public access beach parking lots.
