Here's an update on what's happening around Town:

Get Help Scheduling a COVID-19 Vaccine Shot

Area hospitals and pharmacies continue to work on providing vaccines for COVID-19. A part of getting vaccinated is properly scheduling yourself for an appointment. Members of the Hilton Head Computer Club and Hilton Head Regional Healthcare are hosting two events to help local residents who are 70 and older and do not have an email address or a device to connect to the internet in order to register for a COVID-19 vaccine shot. The events will be held from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Friday, February 5 and Tuesday, February 9, at the Hilton Head Island Senior Center, 70 Shelter Cove Lane. DHEC Launches New COVID-19 Vaccine Information Line

In response to overwhelming call volume to its Care Line, the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) has added a new phone information line to answer questions about COVID-19 vaccines and to help support people searching for vaccine provider information. The new vaccine information line is available from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., seven days a week. COVID-19 Testing

There has been a lot of focus on getting a COVID Vaccine. But, we want to remind you about getting tested for the virus if you suspect you may have been exposed to it. COVID-19 Drive-thru Testing is offered 8 a.m. to noon at Hilton Head Hospital (25 Hospital Center Blvd. on Hilton Head Island) and Coastal Carolina Hospital (1000 Medical Center Drive in Hardeeville). The test is free. No appointment or doctor referral is needed.

ordinances and projects. The public has an opportunity to offer advance feedback on agenda items for the various panels. Agendas for the meetings are posted to our website. You can comment on the items using our Open Town Hall portal, which is accessible from the homepage of our website at hiltonheadislandsc.gov. Those meetings include:

- The Planning Commission at 9 a.m. Agenda items include a review of Town Council's changes related to Workforce Housing LMO Amendments and an Annual Traffic Report.
- A special Town Council meeting at 10 a.m. The main agenda item is an executive session to discuss potential contractual arrangements related to the Palmetto Bay Business Park RFP and pending litigation related to the Beaufort County Law Enforcement Fee.
- The Public Planning Committee at 2 p.m. Agenda items include review and recommendation of revisions on the Sea Turtle Protection Ordinance and an update on the Gullah-Geechee overlay.

SCDOT to Discontinue Toll Collections on Hilton Head's Cross Island Parkway June 30, 2021; Feb. 28 Last Day to Purchase New Palmetto Pass Accounts

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) will stop collecting tolls on Hilton Head Island's Cross Island Parkway at 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2021.

The agency is now preparing to convert the corridor to a non-tolled road, including ceasing the sale of new Palmetto Pass accounts on February 28, 2021. Palmetto Pass customers pay their toll charges with a pre-paid balance instead of stopping at the toll booths on the Parkway to pay in cash. The toll is collected to repay bonds that were issued to build the 7.5 mile road, pay for toll collection operations, and maintain the roadway and facilities. SCDOT will continue maintaining the Parkway as a part of its statewide road system after the toll is discontinued.

According to SCDOT, the toll will have completed its purpose of supporting the Parkway's financing, so it will be discontinued as required by state law. SCDOT is preparing to close out related Palmetto Pass accounts and prepare for construction work to remove the toll facilities on the corridor.

SCDOT and its contractor who operates the toll, Conduent Transportation, will be communicating with the more than 32,000 Palmetto Pass customers during the coming months on procedures to close their accounts, return their transponders, and how they might receive refunds of their deposits. Conduent has begun contacting these customers by mail, email, public and media information, and the Palmetto Pass website, www.crossislandparkway.org.
