Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue Releases 2019 Annual Report

Our Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue has released its 2019 Annual Report. This 50-page report gives a comprehensive overview of the department's accomplishments. Our firefighters, EMTs, paramedics, dispatchers and others do an amazing job taking care of our residents and visitors. Here are some highlights from this report:

Last year, they responded to 7,864 calls for service – the highest in the history of this department. This included 5,514 EMS calls and 2,350 fire/service calls.

The department's survival rate on a five-year rolling average is 55 percent for bystander-witnessed, shockable cardiac arrest patients. 55 percent places Fire Rescue among the best Fire and EMS agencies in the country for out-of-hospital cardiac arrest survival.

The most common type of EMS calls responded to are falls. Sometimes these patients have serious injuries and others times they're not injured. Some have an underlying medical problem that causes the fall and simply need help getting back into a sitting or standing position.

For the second year in a row, we saw a decline in opioid overdoses on Hilton Head compared to the alarming peak we had in 2017.

Here some notable achievements Fire Rescue staff made:

- Accumulated over 43,000 hours of training, including drills, search and rescue, hazmat, officer development, driver operator and other activities.
- Conducted 3,246 fire inspections including building and business license permit inspections, complaint follow ups, hydrant and alarm system repairs, burn permits and other activities.
- Delivered 286 public education programs, taught 590 students CPR, AED and First Aid, and conducted 76 CPR, AED and First Aid classes.
- Investigated 24 fires.

- The E911 Center answered 97% of all phone calls in five seconds or less. Our dispatchers handled over 77,000 calls in 2019.
- Managed the public safety evacuation for Hurricane Dorian.
- Implemented a new patient care reporting system.
- Implemented PulsePoint Respond App. App users who have indicated they are trained in CPR and are willing to assist in case of an emergency are notified if someone nearby is in cardiac arrest and CPR is needed.

Stay Protected with Safety Precautions

It will take action by everyone – residents and visitors – to slow the spread of the coronavirus. COVID-19 Testing Event on June 29th

A COVID-19 Drive-Thru Testing Event will be held in our community on Monday, June 29th, from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue Training Center, 75 Dillon Road.

- Anyone can participate.
- The test is free.
- No appointment is required.
- No doctor's order is required.
- This is only a test for the virus.
- This is not a test for COVID-19 antibodies.

- This will be a nasal swab.
- This is not a rapid test. Results are expected to be returned in 2 to 4 days.
- You will receive phone call with test results.
- There are no prerequisites for the test such as having symptoms.
- Multiple persons within a vehicle may be tested.
- This testing event is hosted jointly by the Hilton Head Island Fire Rescue, Hilton Head Hospital, the Volunteers In Medicine Clinic and SCDHEC.

Cross Island Parkway Update

Currently the toll for the Cross Island Parkway (CIP) is set to expire in 2021. There are some rumors circulating that this parkway, which is owned by the S.C. Department of Transportation, had been paid for. This is not the case. Tolls were lifted in March in line with decreasing traffic volumes and public health measures that were taken in response to COVID-19. Toll collection resumed last Friday after vehicle counts indicated traffic volumes had returned to normal.

Toll collectors will wear gloves and masks while interacting with the public. Frequent CIP are encouraged to apply for a "Palmetto Pass" at www.crossislandparkway.com. This method is an easy way to avoid to contact in a toll booth and reduces toll rates for frequent users. The Cross Island Parkway was opened in 1998 and is one of two toll roads in South Carolina. The toll is \$1.25 per vehicle and provides a time-saving alternative to the William Hilton Parkway.

Breeze Trolley Service Resumes

The Breeze Trolley resumes service today. The service is free this season and has the same route and stops as last year. Palmetto Breeze is taking extra safety precaution for riders including frequent cleaning and disinfecting of the trolleys, clear plexiglass modesty panels beside the trolley driver, "one-way" boarding and exiting procedures (with passengers boarding in front and exiting through the rear door), social distancing while riding, hand sanitizer, and encouraging passengers to wear facial coverings. The service runs 1 p.m. to 10 p.m., Sunday through Thursday, and 1 p.m. to Midnight, Fridays and Saturdays. More information can be found at www.breezetrolley.com.
